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Before SWA Collaborative behaviours

- ◆ Kenya's Constitution and Vision 2030 - enabling environment for the country to ensure that;
 - National Government develop Policies and 47 County governments' domesticate policies and implement/ service delivery, policies, monitoring
 - Ministry of Water: (Policies / Legislation)-WARMA (resource management), WASREB (Regulate)
 - Ministry of Health: Policies, Quarterly sanitation & Hygiene forums



Putting Collaborative behaviors into Practice

- ◆ Country action plan after Addis Ababa Meeting
- ◆ High Level advocacy in all 47 Counties
- ◆ Supporting the inclusion of CBs in County Integrated Development Plans
- ◆ Dissemination of CBs through the quarterly WASH forums (was mainly after Addis Ababa)



Enabling Factors

- ◆ The government has put in place enabling environment (Policies) for all sectors-Private sectors, NGOs, Development partners
- ◆ Strong Government leadership and coordination
- ◆ Decentralized Governance-distinct functions for National and County governments
- ◆ Strengthening M & E in MOH and Water sector



Achievements & opportunities

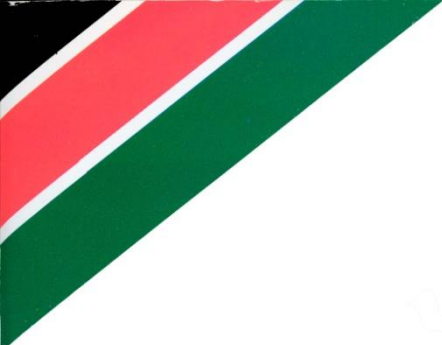
1. Counties are developing integrated plans
2. Counties are devoting legislations to address WASH investments
3. Right to WASH monitoring framework being developed
4. Government is working towards a One Plan for WASH
5. National sanitation conference



Bottlenecks/ opportunities

- Off-budget financing (only UNICEF provides on budget)
- Difficulties to rally together all the partners to agree on process for One Sector Plan
- Investment priorities at counties – e.g. only a few counties factor in sanitation and hygiene in their budgets
- Not able to consistently do JSRs
