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(1) Kenyas progress on planning for SDGs



Background;

- ❑ Kenya had already developed a blue print, "The Vision 2030" which was launched in October 2006 before the SDGs,
- ❑ The vision is based on three "**pillars**" , **Economic, Social and Political.**
- ❑ Water , sanitation and hygiene is under the **social Pillar**

Situation as at now;

- ❑ Alignment of Policy documents to the constitution and Vision 2030-(National water Master Plan 2013-2030, Water Act 2016, water policy 1999, water strategic plan 2013-2017, Sanitation and hygiene Policy 2016-2030, Sanitation & hygiene strategy 2016-2020, Open defecation free road map 2016-2020, Prototype county sanitation & hygiene Bill, Draft National sanitation & hygiene Bill 2017, and online monitoring framework ending open defecation)

(2) Processes used for planning



- ❑ Vertical ministerial discussions on SDGs (Ministry of water),
- ❑ Kenya National Bureau of Statistics –KNBS TWG convenes a meeting every quarter
- ❑ Utilised government planning processes (CIDPs, AWP, MTEF, MTPIII,)
- ❑ Use the sanitation & hygiene quarterly forums and water forums/ SWA HLM planning processes
- ❑ Yet to engage all stakeholders to discuss SDGs progress...



(3) Evidence & Data;



- ❑ Agreed to use the existing AMCOW Country monitoring frameworks
- ❑ Used JMP data, MOH data, MOWI data country sanitation micro-plan

(4) Political and multi-stakeholder engagement

- ❑ Engaged the county government in the drafting of Bills and policies. Some Governors became champions of Sanitation (Kitui/ Nakuru county)
- ❑ Stakeholders engagements, ie through our quarterly forums



Priority actions and course correction:



- ❑ Stakeholders engagement to discuss SDGs indicators / progress
-involve partners in WASH, KNBS, Ministries responsible
- ❑ Engage county government in the SDGs
- ❑ Strengthen implementation of CBs and building blocks by the 47 counties and partners track progress
